

Dr. Katherine Kula* Dr. Kula taught and practiced for more than 40 years before retiring as the Jarabak Endowed Professor and Chairperson of the Department of Orthodontics and Oral Facial Genetics at the Indiana University School of Dentistry. Recently, she co-edited the book "Cephalometry in Orthodontics; 2D and 3D."

Radiology Update for the Clinical Orthodontist

Similar to the initial use of cephalometry in orthodontics, the evolution from two dimensional (2D) to three dimensional (3D) cephalometry is occurring faster in research than in clinical practice. This talk will present information acquired using 3D radiology about diagnosis, the effect of various orthodontic procedures on dental and boney structures, and its current use in forensics. In addition, it will present various issues involved with 2D and 3D cephalometry. Recommendations will be made that should help clinicians make decisions about using 2D vs. 3D radiology and about purchasing the 3D CBCT machine best suited for their office. By the end of this talk, the clinician should be able to list:

- Conditions in which 3D cephalometrics can help with diagnosis and treatment.
- The effects of various orthodontic procedures such as rapid maxillary expansion on the dental and boney structures of the maxilla and differences between various expansion protocol.
- Images that could help identify skull remains.
- Issues involved with 2D and 3D cephalometry.
- Points to consider when purchasing a 3D CBCT machine for the office.

Dr. Dellinger is a second-generation orthodontist whose father was one of the charter members of the College of Diplomates. He graduated from St. Louis University with a M.S.D. in orthodontics in 1992 and has been in private practice in Angola, Indiana since that time. He has taught for over 20 years at Indiana University School of Dentistry in Fort Wayne and is currently serving as president of the College.

Sleep Apnea, a Case Review with Three Different Treatment Modalities

This is a case report of a 50-year-old Caucasian male patient with self-reported sleep issues. Sleep apnea was diagnosed by his physician following a sleep study and several modes of treatment were attempted. Oral-Nasal soft and hard tissue surgery was initially attempted, followed by an oral appliance, and finally an orthognathic surgical correction was done to successfully treat this patient. Review of treatments and suggestions regarding treatments of future patients will be reviewed. Attendees will be given ideas to assist treatment planning for sleep apnea patients as well as some areas to consider that will hopefully prevent difficulties in treating these patients.

Dr. Jason Cope*

Dr. Cope has been honored to be named the College's Ray Thurow Honorary Lecturer for this meeting. He received his DDS, Orthodontic Certificate, and PhD from Baylor College of Dentistry. He currently teaches in the Orthodontic Departments at Baylor and St. Louis University. He has published 32 journal articles, 36 book chapters, and two orthodontic textbooks. In addition, he has given over 320 presentations around the world. Dr. Cope's private practice is

located in Dallas, Texas where he treats patients three days a week.

Using TADs to Restore DentoFacial Balance

Dr. Cope uses his unique PhD background in bone biology in combination with basic biomechanical principles to explain the fundamentals of orthodontic miniscrew implant placement, loading, and use in a way that few other speakers can, and with success rates over 95%. This presentation will focus on the movement of teeth in the anteroposterior dimension using miniscrew implants. Both Class II and Class II mechanics will be discussed. Several of Dr. Cope's Class III treatment protocols will be shown and discussed for a historical perspective before focusing on the current protocol, which accomplishes fairly dramatic results using miniscrews in lieu of miniplates.

- Appreciate the clinical applications of MSI placement and use for Class III cases.
- Understand treatment planning stages for MSI placement in anteroposterior cases.

Dr. Ng completed his undergraduate and dental education at the University of Manitoba in Winnipeg, Canada and graduated from St. Louis University with a M.S.D. in orthodontics. Dr. Ng is a Diplomate of the American Board of Orthodontics and Fellow of the Royal College of Dentists in Canada. He maintains his private practice in Cypress and Katy, Texas.

Achieving Harmony in the Treatment of Asymmetric Malocclusions

Asymmetric malocclusions are some of the most difficult cases to treat for the orthodontic specialist. The pre-treatment dental midlines play a large part in the diagnosis and treatment planning for cases exhibiting asymmetry. Dr. Ng will present clinical cases using asymmetric extractions and/or asymmetric mechanics to more easily achieve successful outcomes in dental midline correction and better harmony with the facial midline.

- Identifying the maxillary and mandibular dental midlines in asymmetric malocclusion.
- Set treatment goals and proper informed consent with the orthodontic patient in cases exhibiting asymmetric malocclusion.
- Using asymmetric extractions and/or asymmetric mechanics to more easily achieve a successful treatment outcome.

Dr. Straty Righellis, a Diplomate of the American Board of Orthodontics, is an Associate Clinical Professor at the University of the Pacific, and University of California at San Francisco, Schools of Dentistry. He graduated from UCLA Dental School and received his orthodontic specialty certification from University of California at San Francisco. In addition, he maintains an active private practice in Oakland, California.

Treatment Times, Efficiency and Excellence – What Really Works for Patients?

This presentation will discuss the three keys to treatment efficiency and excellence. 


