Key Factors in Anterior Open Bite Correction

Anterior open bite (AOB) is difficult to treat because it results from the interaction of multiple etiologic factors such as heredity, unfavorable mandibular growth patterns, imbalance between the posture of the jaws, nasopharyngeal airway obstruction, digit-sucking habits, and tongue posture and activity. Proper diagnosis and treatment planning, successful treatment, and retention are important to the long-term stability

of open bite treatment. In this lecture, the etiology of AOB and various treatment modalities will be discussed along with biomechanics. After the lecture, clinicians will be able to treat and finish anterior open bite cases more efficiently and successfully.

- Discuss the etiology of AOB and treatment modalities
- Evaluate upper airway dimension after AOB correction
- Know which factors affect the success of AOB correction

Anterior Open Bite Correction: Surgery vs. TSADs

AOB can be corrected by orthognathic surgery or orthodontic treatment. Severe skeletal, facial, and functional problems require orthognathic surgery for correction, but combining cone-beam computed tomography (CBCT) and temporary skeletal anchorage devices (TSADs) provides an efficient and accurate way to correct AOB. TSADs have expanded orthodontic boundaries. In this lecture, various clinical applications of TSADs and orthognathic

surgery will be discussed in challenging AOB cases along with the new American Board of Orthodontics (ABO) Scenario-based Oral Clinical Examination domains. After the lecture, clinicians will be able to:

- Discuss how to prepare for the new ABO Scenario-based Clinical Examination in diagnosis and treatment planning, treatment implementation and management, and critical analysis and outcomes assessment of AOB cases
- Identify clinical situations in which CBCT imaging and TSADs can be used to successfully and efficiently treat and finish AOB cases while minimizing the chance of relapse
- Understand clinical applications and biomechanical considerations of orthognathic surgery vs. TSADs in challenging AOB cases

Finishing in Orthodontic Treatment: A Contemporary Perspective

Finishing in orthodontic treatment immediately evokes the mental image of the occlusal relationships and "detailing." This is a major aspect of orthodontic treatment — the improvement and correction of functional relationships. In the recent two decades, an emphasis on esthetic outcomes has made significant strides in orthodontic treatment goal setting. Esthetic finishing of our orthodontic outcomes really begins with the initial treatment plan, but the principles of macro-mini-microesthetics have to be staged during treatment to reach the optimal result. In this presentation, Dr. Sarver will visit the many aspects of esthetic finishing that significantly raises the level of patient satisfaction in their orthodontic treatment experience. This lecture will:

- Describe the checklist approach to treatment planning flowcharts
- Cover the techniques of both soft and hard tissue finishing for maximum esthetic outcome
- Cover appropriate instrumentation and timing for esthetic finishing

Early Orthodontic Treatment Outcomes: What Clinicians Should Know

Numerous questions have been raised regarding early orthodontic treatment because of controversies and misconceptions. Recent systematic reviews have reported that the level of evidence was not sufficient to reveal the effectiveness of early orthodontic treatment because of a lack of standardization of diagnostic criteria and treatment protocol, adequate methodology, and long-term follow-up studies.

Observation and understanding of occlusal changes that occur during the transitional dentition is imperative to determine when early orthodontic treatment is indicated. This presentation will illustrate the different treatment modalities that could be applied to prevent, intercept and correct malocclusion at an early stage of dental development.

The efficacy of early orthodontic treatment in Class I, Class II and Class III malocclusions will be discussed and orthodontists will be able to:

- Evaluate factors that contribute to malocclusions during the transitional dentition period
- Understand which malocclusions could be intercepted and corrected during the early stages of dentitional development
- Understand which malocclusions can be efficiently treated during the transitional dentition



EXPERIENCE WITH THE VAUGHTS SUGGESTED THINGS TO DO:

Founded in 1773, General James Oglethorpe designed Savannah as one of the first planned cities in the country by laying it out in a grid pattern. Today there are 22 historic squares, each with a unique personality, just waiting to be explored. Learn more at www. savannah.com/savannahs-historic-squares/

Discover the rich religious history of the city that includes the 3rd oldest Jewish Congregation in America, a Catholic Basilica, the oldest Episcopal Church in the state, and the First African Baptist Church that was founded in 1733.

Explore the roof tops of Savannah. There are many rooftop bars that offer unique views of the city, cargo ships, and massive oak trees. Suggestions include: Cotton Sail Hotel, Rocks on the Roof, Drayton Hotel, The Grove, Top Deck Bar, and Peregrin.

When author John Berendt recalled his first visit to Savannah he was told: If you go to Atlanta, the first question people ask you is, "What's your business?" In Augusta they ask your grandmother's maiden name. But in Savannah the first question people ask you is, "What would you like to drink?" It's not surprising with this attitude that the historic district has an open container policy which makes it easy to get your favorite cocktail in a "to go cup."

Discover why people flock to Savannah simply to dine. Make reservations at least a month in advance. Some favorites include: The Grey, The Pink House, Saint Neo's, Vic's on the River, Garibaldi, Noble Fare, Local 11 Ten, Stone & Webster Chophouse, Husk, Fox and Fig, Circa 1875, and Collins Quarter. A few outstanding restaurants do not take reservations but they are well worth the wait: Chive Sea Bar, Flying Monk. The best pizza in town is at Vinnie Van Go Gos.

Wander the prettiest street in America. On Jones Street, the beautiful 19th century homes are framed by an overarching canopy of Live Oak trees draped with Spanish moss.

Art lovers will not be disappointed. Consider visiting the Telfair Museum, the Jepson Center or the Museum at the Savannah College of Art and Design. Also, there is no shortage of small galleries showcasing local artists.

Get a glimpse into the past by visiting one of the historic homes. Recommendations include: Owens-Thomas House, Juliette Gordon Low's Birthplace, Andrew Low House, and Harper Fowlkes House.

Discovering local beer is a fun way to spend the afternoon. Visit one or possibly more of the local breweries. Our favorites include: Two Tides and Southbound.

There are trendy boutiques scattered around the city. Some of our favorites include: The Paris Market, One Fish Two Fish, E. Shaver Books, Savannah Bee Company, and Copper Penny.

It is an easy 30-minute drive from Savannah to the Atlantic Ocean. If you go to Tybee, stop to visit its historic lighthouse. Fort Pulaski, which guarded the Savannah River entrance during the Civil War. It is a National Monument and also on the way.
