confusion, in our future communications, we will be referred to as "The College of Diplomates." We will always be CDABO, but hopefully the new emphasis will help avoid the confusion between the two organizations.

- 2. Expanding our communication base by developing a "state of the art" Web site. Electronic communication is efficient and the Web site will be an additional benefit to our members.
- 3. Continue our support and interactions with the ABO.

The Council is sensitive to the fact that all of our members may not be satisfied with the new certification process. Some of our members have asked, "How could we agree with giving a certification to an orthodontist who has recently graduated out of residency? Don't they have to prove themselves? Should they not have to show cases? How do we know if a resident can produce a board quality result?"

In this context it is important to emphasize a few facts. Upon graduation from an accredited orthodontic program an orthodontist must first pass the written exam and then will have three exam opportunities (held in February of each year) to present six specified cases treated during their residency, which must meet ABO standards. A 10 year time-limited certificate will be issued. The Board certified orthodontist must recertify within 10 years, presenting six cases from their private clinical practice. That is two more cases than the current Option 1 and six more than the Option 2. In other words, two Board exams of six cases each presented within the first 10 years of practice, followed by recertifying exams on a 10-year frequency are needed.

Most people now realize that early certification is actually as or more "demanding" than the other options. We believe that this new process will provide some incentive to the practitioner to maintain quality orthodontic treatment throughout their career. Details on these options are available on ABO's Web site at www.americanboardortho.com.

I am very honored to represent The College of Diplomates and it is important for me to hear your opinions and your thoughts. My e-mail and phone numbers are on our Web site at www.cdabo.org. Please feel free to contact me on any issue whether you agree or disagree. This is your College and it is important for the members of the Council to hear from you.

Speaking on the Council's behalf we would like to thank you for your support. As for me, it has been the highlight of my career to be your president and serve our profession in such a capacity.

- Redesigning the brochure called "Your Orthodontist Has Taken a Step Beyond."
- Added members to the Mentor Committee due to an increase in activity.
- Assisting the ABO in clinical grading as some Councilors are asked by ABO.
