The Scientific Topic for the 2024 Annual Meeting is Navigating Tough Challenges

he number of adults in our patient pool is growing. The needs of these adult patients are unique, with challenges in diagnosis and treatment. Orthodontists cannot treat the adult patient or complex case by themselves due to underlying periodontal issues, missing teeth, skeletal abnormalities and/or unattended developmental defects. Dental specialists and medical colleagues play an important role along with orthodontists to resolve these complex cases and treat them successfully. We decided to seek clinicians with years of experience in interdisciplinary care to help us focus on Navigating Tough Challenges.

Our first speaker on Saturday is **Dr. Hugo De Clerck** and his topic is **True Mandibular Lengthening with Bone Screws**. The next speaker is **Dr. Ashok Kothari**, current College President, who will be speaking on **Management of Complex Cases with Interdisciplinary Treatment**. With more than 40 years of experience working together on an interdisciplinary team, Dr. Kothari has successfully treated many unique cases.

On Sunday morning, **Dr. Frank Celenza** will start the session with a talk on **Ortho/Perio** in the Aligner Age. Dr. Celenza holds dual certification in both orthodontics and periodontics. Our next speaker, **Dr. Roger Wise**, will be speaking on **Treatment of the Periodontally Compromised Patient Utilizing Invocative and Effective Team Collaboration**. Savannah – The Spirit of the South

ounded in 1773, General James Oglethorpe designed
Savannah as one of the first planned cities in the country
by laying it out in a grid pattern. Today there are 22 historic
squares, each with a unique personality, just waiting to be
explored. More information is available at www.savannah.com/
savannah-historic-squares/.

Discover the rich religious history of the city that includes the third oldest Jewish Congregation in America, a Catholic Basilica, the oldest Episcopal Church in Georgia and the First African Baptist Church that was founded in 1733.

Explore the roof tops of Savannah. There are many rooftop bars that offer unique views of the city, cargo ships and massive oak trees. Suggestions include Cotton Sail Hotel, Rocks on the Roof, Drayton Hotel, The Grove, Top Deck Bar and Peregrin.

Discover why people flock to Savannah simply to dine. Make reservations at least a month in advance. Some favorites include: The Grey, The Pink House, Saint Neo's, Vic's on the River, Garibaldi, Noble Fare, Local 11 Ten, Stone & Webster Chophouse, Husk, Fox and Fig, Circa 1875 and Collins Quarter. A few restaurants do not take reservations but they are well worth the wait: Chive Sea Bar and Flying Monk. The best pizza in town is Vinnie Van GoGo's. Don't forget to enjoy the famous Leopold's Ice cream in the historic district and at Savannah airport. Savanna Pralines are also not to be missed.

Wander the prettiest streets in America. On Jones Street, the beautiful 19th century homes are framed by an overarching canopy of Live Oak trees draped with Spanish moss.

Art lovers will not be disappointed. Consider visiting Telfair Museum, the Jepson Center or the Museum at the Savannah College of Art and Design. There are plenty of small galleries showcasing local artists.

Get a glimpse into the past by visiting one of the historic homes. Recommendations include: Owens-Thomas House, Juliette Gordon Lowe's Birthplace, Andrew Low House and Harper Fowlkes House.

Discovering local beer is a fun way to spend the afternoon. Check out the local breweries such as Tides and Southbound.

There are trendy boutiques scattered around the city. Some of the favorites include: The Paris Market, One Fish Two Fish, E.Shaver Books, Savannah Bee Company and Copper Penny.

It is an easy 30-minute drive from Savannah to the Atlantic Ocean. If you go to Tybee, stop to visit its historic lighthouse and Fort Pulaski which guarded the Savannah River entrance during the Civil War. It is a National Monument.

You may enjoy relaxing and not want to leave the resort...watch expansive cargo ships traveling along Savannah River, play the 18-hole PGA championship golf course, check out the new tennis complex, relax with an appointment at the Heavenly Spa, take a long walk or enjoy the hotel amenities which include a heated outdoor poor and fitness center with sauna and workout classes.

The College looks forward to seeing you at this exciting venue. So gear up for the adventure and join us in 2025!


